## 2012 PROGRAMS

### *BASIC*

Brothers And Sisters In Christ (B.A.S.I.C.) is our most attended camp throughout the summer. Youth enjoy a variety of activities tailored to the interest of the cabin group. Activities may include archery, boating, swimming, ultimate Frisbee, and volleyball among many others. AGES: 2nd-4th, 4th-6th, 6th-9th Grade

### *BASIC PLUS*

B.A.S.I.C. Plus is exactly what it sounds like – B.A.S.I.C. camp PLUS one day trip to Mt. Olympus in Wisconsin Dells. Staff and campers will travel to the park for a full day of supervised fun and excitement. Campers will leave LuWiSoMo following breakfast and will return with plenty of time to enjoy supper and join the rest of the campers with campfire singing and devotions.

*Cost of camp includes transportation to and from Mt. Olympus, admission to all four parks – indoor and outdoor water parks and theme parks for fun rain or shine, and lunch. Minimum 15*

AGES: 2nd-4th Grade 4th-6th Grade 6th-9th Grade 9-12th Grade

### *ROCKETRY*

Each camper will construct and fly a high quality model rocket while learning about how the rockets work. Each camper will be given the opportunity to launch his or her rocket during the course of the week.

Min. 4/Max. 10 AGES: 2nd-4th Grade

### *ROCKETRY II*

Campers in Rocketry II will construct two-stage rockets, work together in teams to design a rocket, launch them, and learn special tips and hints to improve their models. Special supervision each step of the way will ensure each camper's safety. Min. 2/Max. 10 AGES: 4th-6th Grade 6-9th Grade

### *HUNTER SAFETY*

Campers will complete the DNR Safety program and be ready to hunt in the fall. This course teaches Safe firearm handling, and safety in the home and field. The course includes supervised shooting at a range and individual study. Guns and Ammunition provided. Min. 2/Max. 20 AGES: 6th-9th Grade

### **2012 Theme Information: "We Are One" Eph. 4:4-6**

Today's culture is steeped in a "me-first" mindset, yet bursting at the seams with pleas for a way to be connected to others. Society calls for a sense of individualism, a need to express oneself, a need to stand out, a push to be different and set apart and singled out. We see this everyday in the way people dress, the things they say, and even the over-the-top actions they may take to draw attention to the fact that they are an individual. But under this outward display of individuality, we turn to social networks such as Myspace and Facebook to connect with people, we post updates on Twitter in hopes that someone will read them and connect with us. We isolate through the media of the internet, but use it in an avid desperation for connection.

That underlying need for connection, companionship, and acceptance is natural. God created us uniquely and individually, but also to function as a community of believers. Our theme verse for 2012 emphasizes this sense of community and encourages individuals to look past the distinctive differences and see the heart of the matter - we are all children of God, saved through faith in Christ Jesus. Paul stresses this fact by dwelling on the oneness of all believers; Grace is inclusive.

It's a blessing to be an individual, to have unique gifts and talents that God has bestowed to use for his glory. But the church as a whole, the believers across the world, are called to be one. Give thanks for your unique characteristics, but relish the support and love found in the "one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all."

Summer camp is an opportunity to live in that community of believers. Youth ages 3 through 18 spend their time in Bible study, worship, and recreation with brothers and sisters in that family of one, led by trained mentors in the faith.

### *OWL / SPACE CAMP*

Owl campers will participate in all of the activities that a normal youth camp would, only overnight. In addition they will also have the opportunity to do night hikes, outdoor cooking, and many other fun things that can't be done during the day. Youth will have a graduated schedule that will allow them to sleep during the day and stay up at night. Along with these activities, our guest presenter will be leading a variety of activities that will expand their knowledge of God's awesome universe. These activities include slide shows, computer satellite tracking, and stargazing with a high-powered telescope.

### *ART CAMP*

This program is designed to give individuals interested in the visual arts an opportunity to explore mediums and styles including paint, clay, and charcoal. Each day will include brief instruction and ample working time.

### *GUITAR CAMP*

Youth are asked to bring their own guitar (acoustic preferred). Youth will learn strum patterns, chords, and all their favorite camp songs which they will have the opportunity to play during Chapel and campfire.

### *BIKE CAMP*

Camp Bikes are provided. A daily Bike ride will be part of the experience visiting area attractions. Grades 2-4 will experience short trips to area parks and spend one night at a campground. Grades 4-12 will take longer trips and camp at 3 separate locations during the bike tour. Camping equipment will be delivered to sites where the group camps. Bring your own bike helmet.

### Deadlines and Important dates

All paperwork must be received at least one month prior to the start of the selected camp. For example, if your child is attending a camp which begins on June 24, your registration form, information form, and medical form must be postmarked by May 24.

### Financial Information

Specialty camps often require extra supplies, extra staffing, and occasionally transportation, additional charges will apply to those camps.

Thanks to funds raised by individuals as well as by LuWiSoMo's Golf Outing, and Family Weekend sponsors, scholarships are available to campers with financial need. We desire all campers to be able to attend camp, regardless of financial situations. **All requests for camperships must be postmarked by March 31.**

### Ways to Register

**By Mail:** Fill out the appropriate registration form and return it with your full payment or your deposit of \$100 per camper to Camp LuWiSoMo, W5421 Aspen Rd, Wild Rose WI 54984-9177. Please include a copy of your insurance card (front and back.)

**By Fax:** Fax your registration form, with credit card information, to (920)240-4360. Fax registrations will only be accepted with a credit card payment. If you fax your registration form, please do not send an additional form through the mail.

Registrations will not be accepted over the phone. Unfortunately the traffic on our phone system is too high to accept registrations in this manner. However, the fax line will be open.

After receiving your application, you will receive a confirmation packet including a camper information form, a medical form, an invoice for the remaining balance, and general information regarding registration, pick-up, and other FAQs.

Please note that your application will not be processed until these forms have been received by camp.

### Canteen Information

Campers will have two stops at the canteen during each full camp day. The canteen stocks a variety of snack and drinks as well as clothing and other small Camp LuWiSoMo souvenirs. Typical canteen amounts for week-long programs are 10-\$20. Any money not used will be refunded at the end of the week.

### **Camp LuWiSoMo Summer Staff**

Camp LuWiSoMo hires and trains college-age individuals to provide the best possible care for your child while at camp. Each staff member is certified in CPR and First Aid as part of staff training.

During the course of the summer, high school volunteers join the counseling staff to work together to provide a positive experience for all campers.

These volunteers attend an intense weekend training session prior to serving with the counselor.

### Theme T-shirts

Pre-order your theme t-shirt for \$11 by filling in the amount on the appropriate line on the registration form. Pre-orders **MUST** be received by March 31. After March 31, t-shirts will be available for purchase from the canteen for \$13 when you drop off or pick up your child. If you would like your child to purchase a shirt from the canteen, they will have the opportunity to purchase theme t-shirts Sunday or Thursday nights at the canteen. For this option, please include an additional \$13 to your child's canteen amount to cover the cost of the shirt. With the exception of pre-orders, we cannot guarantee sizes to be in stock. Order early to be sure you have a shirt that fits!

### Horse Ride Information

Horse rides are not available at this time.

### Cancellation Policy

If cancellation is made prior to 30 day before the scheduled camp, a full refund will be made, minus a \$25 processing fee. No refunds will be granted within 30 days of the registered camp except in cases of family death or illness. All requests for refunds must be made in written form.

### Youth Camp Programs

All campers will participate in a number of spiritual growth opportunities including daily Bible study, chapel, campfire, and cabin devotions in addition to their games and activities.

As a Christ-centered environment, all participants in camp programs are expected to build one another up in Christian love. Appropriate attire, actions, and speech is expected of all campers, volunteers, and staff. In the event of inappropriate attire, actions, or speech, staff will work with campers on a case-to-case basis.

Camp programs are designed to give each individual camper the most positive experience possible. In order to help achieve that goal, each week is designed with a specific age group or range in mind. Activities, cabin group relationships, and spiritual growth are more effective when the ages are grouped in this manner. Grades for programs are based on the 2011-2012 school year.

### Joyful Hearts Programs

The Joyful Hearts program is designed for persons who have developmental disabilities. This program provides a quality camping experience in a safe, Christian environment. Our trained staff members are committed to ensuring that each camper receives personal guidance and assistance as needed.

Due to the nature of the program and facilities, some physical restrictions apply. All participants must be ambulatory with the ability to handle walking long distances, as well as up and down hills. It is also necessary that all campers be able to take care of personal hygiene needs. Once all necessary forms are received, the camper's application will be reviewed to determine whether Camp LuWiSoMo can provide the most positive experience for the camper.
