Registration Information

- Please complete the registration form on the back. Print clearly. Person making reservation must be at least 21.
- Reservations may be made one year in advance. Call for availability. We will contact you if somebody else has already booked the dates and location you have requested.
- Please include your e-mail address, which allows us to confirm your registration more efficiently. Your e-mail address will not be shared.
- Unless other arrangements are made, **check-in is 3 p.m.** or later and **check-out is 2 p.m.** or earlier.
- Campsites are limited to 6 people per site. Additional persons are \$2/person/night.
- Weekend rates are for Friday nights, Saturday nights, and holidays. Weekday rates are non-holiday Sunday through Thursday nights.
- Log Cabins require a minimum two nights stay.
- Linens are not included but are available upon request for the Log Cabins at \$5 per person.
- Reservations are not final until the required deposit is received.
- Full payment is required in advance (except for larger groups—see below).
- Reservations for five or more sites/cabins need only pay the first night's fee as a non-refundable deposit. Remaining balance is due two weeks before your arrival.
- Groups should provide a Certificate of Insurance.

LuWiSoMo Guidelines

1. Camp LuWiSoMo is a Christian camp. We expect everyone who uses our facilities to conduct themselves in a Christian manner.
2. Quiet hours are from 10 p.m. to 7 a.m.
3. Obey all posted signs.
4. No fireworks, firearms, chain saws, or off-road vehicles allowed without prior permission.
5. Responsible use of alcohol is permitted at your site only. No alcohol is permitted at Main Camp or the waterfront.
6. No smoking in any buildings.
7. Pets must be leashed and attended at all times. You must pick up after your pet. Animals are not allowed in any buildings.
8. Due to safety concerns and state regulations, the waterfront is closed from dusk to dawn. Swim at your own risk-when lifeguard is not on duty.
9. Respect camp property. Please report any damage immediately to the camp staff. Intentional or careless damage will be charged to the people responsible.
10. Fires may be built in existing fire pits only. Do not dig new pits. Do not cut or burn green wood. Please do not burn garbage.
11. Do not remove picnic tables from other sites. Each site has only one picnic table.
12. Clean up after yourself. Leave LuWiSoMo looking better than it did when you arrived.



Any persons or groups failing to follow these guidelines will be asked to leave.

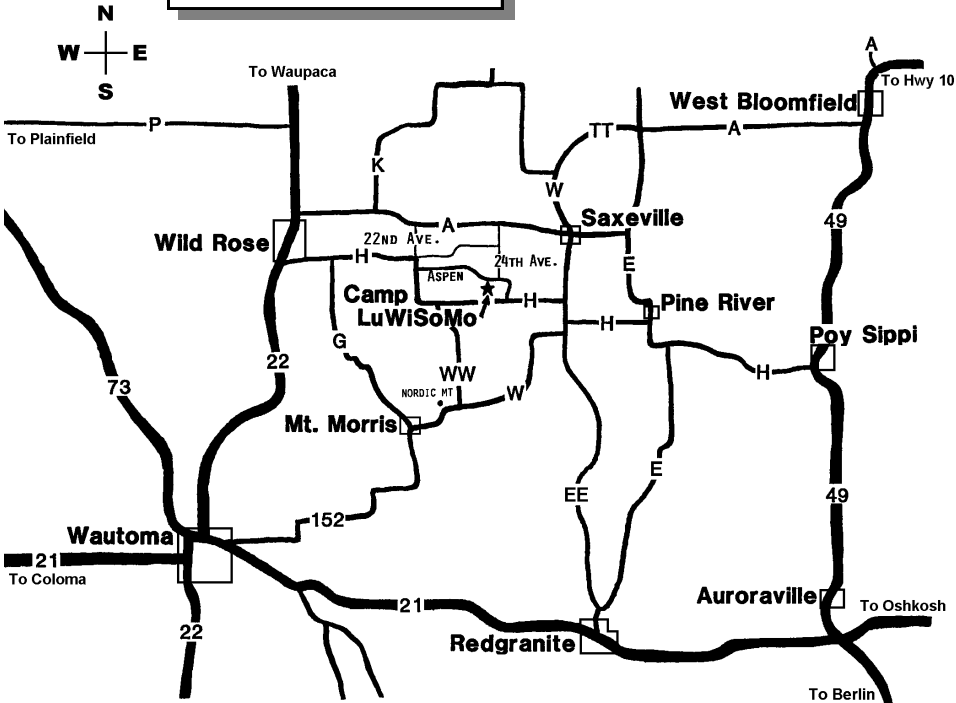

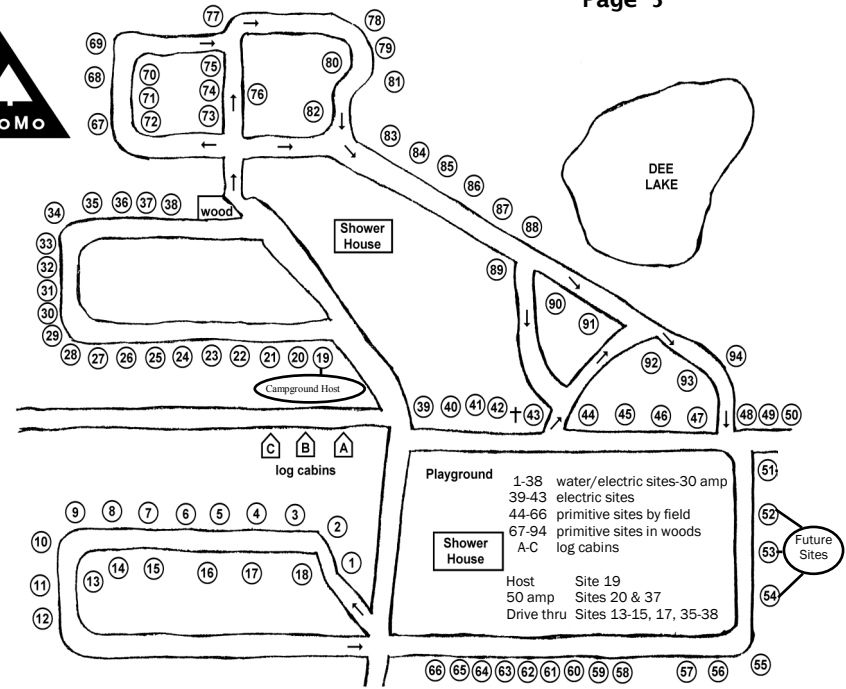
